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


Goal 1: The percentage of graduates who will achieve college, career, or military readiness will increase from 22% (2021) to 70% by November 2026.

The plan moving forward into next Quarter is to:

- Professional Development: Organize training sessions for district-level CCMR staff, SFSCs, and campus principals. Topics include CCMR coding, supporting diverse postsecondary pathways, A-F Accountability System, and leveraging data for student engagement.
- Academic Counseling: Work with 11th and 12th-grade students to create individualized success plans based on their CCMR pathways, ensuring
 each student has access to pathway-aligned resources, such as college fairs, internships, or mentorships.
- Implement Regular PEIMS Data Audits: Conduct monthly audits of PEIMS data to ensure accurate coding of student data related to CCMR point acquisition, and provide training session for staff on proper coding procedures.
- Gather and Analyze Student Interest Data: Distribute interest surveys to students, hold focus groups, and analyze Quarter 1 CCMR participation data to align programs with student interests.
- TSI Rollout: Continue implementing TPHS TSI Rollout Plan to capture 12th grade student data.
- Explore Options for 2025-2026: Based on student interest data and CCMR program participation, consider refining or expanding CCMR pathways to include emerging fields or high-demand career options relevant to the local economy.
