<p><b>The plan moving forward into next Quarter is . . .</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Schedule and Facilitate Monthly Collaboration Meetings: Establish monthly meeting schedule for district-level CCMR staff, Student and Family Services Coordinators (SFSC), and Campus Principals to discuss CCMR program updates and address any challenges throughout the year.</li> <li>• Conduct a Comprehensive Survey and Data Analysis: Distribute surveys to students and staff to gather feedback on CCMR programs, analyze performance data from upcoming quarters.</li> <li>• Implement Regular PEIMS Data Audits: Conduct monthly audits of PEIMS data to ensure accurate coding of student data related to CCMR point acquisition, and provide training session for staff on proper coding procedures.</li> <li>• Gather and Analyze Student Interest Data: Distribute interest surveys to students, hold focus groups, and analyze Quarter 1 CCMR participation data to align programs with student interests.</li> <li>• Audit and Align 11<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> Grade Student Schedules to CCMR Pathways: Conduct a comprehensive audit of 12<sup>th</sup> grade student schedules to ensure alignment with CCMR pathways, prioritizing college and career readiness. Adjust schedules as needed to place students on appropriate pathways.</li> <li>• Ensure all students who are on a military pathway are also placed on a college or career pathway.</li> </ul>
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
